

# JUSTICE AT LAST!

## Labour's legacy of council tax misery finally comes to an end as Conservatives successfully negotiate a freeze for 2014 - 15

Councillors Marilyn Ashton and Ramji Chauhan were at the thick of the action as the Conservative Campaign to freeze Council Tax concluded with a victory for the residents of Harrow.

Marilyn, said; "we are going to prove to the residents of the Borough that we can deliver a cleaner, safer and fairer Harrow for less! That's what the residents deserve after suffering the mismanagement of the Council by Labour!"

Ramji, added; "this is going to help Harrow's most vulnerable people who were affected badly by Labour's obsession with raising taxes. Now residents will not have to worry about yet another tax hike and they can decide for themselves how to spend their hard earned wages."

## High Priority Given to Planning Enforcement

Planning enforcement has been given a high priority by the new Conservative council, under cabinet member Stephen Greek. Extra resources have been given to the enforcement team, increasing the number of officers from 2 to 5, to deal with the huge backlog of cases left by Labour. Over 300 potential 'beds in sheds' were found using heat mapping technology and are now being investigated. An enforcement notice has also been issued to tackle problems at The Hive in Edgware - this has now gone to appeal and residents will be able to give their views at the planning inquiry later this year.

## Good news on extra school places at Harrow East schools



Bob Blackman MP has welcomed the £70 million being provided by the Conservative led Government to provide more than 3,000 additional school places across Harrow. This is in stark contrast to the failure of the last Labour Government to provide these much needed places.

Harrow Conservatives have lobbied hard to obtain this funding. 2 years ago, Harrow's Labour Administration failed to even submit a bid for funding so no money was allocated to Harrow!

Cllr Ramji Chauhan welcomed the news, "This is great news for local parents who want a place at Harrow East schools. There is nothing more important than providing the best start in life for our children."

## Expanding Avanti Free School

Conservative lead Harrow Council has supported a feasibility study into the use of Whitchurch playing fields in Stanmore, as site for the expansion of Avanti free school - the only school of its kind in the whole of the UK.

Conservatives believe that it should be agreed that the fields be well maintained and remain open to other schools and communities if permission for the expansion is granted.
