The road surface on these roads was in a very poor state. We raised this with the Council and we are pleased to report that both roads have now been re-surfaced.

### Culver Grove

Damaged wire boundary fencing at the Centenary Park was reported to the Council and we got it repaired.

### Derwent Crescent

Hedges by the public footpath were not being maintained. We spoke to the Council and hedges were trimmed to enable motorists to see approaching vehicles on the bend.

### Mollison Way

There were numerous instances of fly-tipping of beds and mattresses including old furniture in the vicinity. We got the Council to clear the waste. We will continue to monitor the area on a regular basis.

## High Priority Given to Planning Enforcement

Planning enforcement has been given a high priority by the new Conservative council, under cabinet member Stephen Greek. Extra resources have been given to the enforcement team, increasing the number of officers from 2 to 5, to deal with the huge backlog of cases left by Labour. Over 300 potential 'beds in sheds' were found using heat mapping technology and are now being investigated.

## Good news on extra school places at Harrow East schools



Bob Blackman MP has welcomed the £70 million being provided by the Conservative led Government to provide more than 3,000 additional school places across Harrow. This is in stark contrast to the failure of the last Labour Government to provide these much needed places.

Harrow Conservatives have lobbied hard to obtain this funding. 2 years ago, Harrow's Labour Administration failed to even submit a bid for funding so no money was allocated to Harrow!

Local candidate Panna Raja said, "This is great news for local parents who want a place at Harrow East schools. There is nothing more important than providing the best start in life for our children."

## Expanding Avanti Free School

Conservative lead Harrow Council has supported a feasibility study into the use of Whitchurch playing fields in Stanmore, as site for the expansion of Avanti free school - the only school of its kind in the whole of the UK.
